Wasilla City

Councilmember Diana Straub:

- commented that the School Board would be hosting town meetings on December 4 and 11, 2003, to discuss the quality of education for students in the school district;
- noted that on December 8 and 10, 2003, the School Board would host a meeting to discuss the overcrowding of Wasilla area elementary schools;
- stated that the School Board would be attending the Association of Alaska School Boards Annual Conference in Anchorage;
- discussed the resolutions that would be discussed at the conference; and
- stated that he would provide the Assembly with a copy of the resolutions.

3. State Lobbyist – Ray Gillespie

Mr. Ray Gillespie:

- discussed several major issues that occurred at the last legislative session;
- reviewed the Assembly's priorities listed for next year: education, transportation, and community and economic development; and
- recommended that the Assembly adopt a mechanism to provide the Manager and Lobbyist with direction to address last-minute state legislation.

- thanked Senator Green for providing the latest information on the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP);
- proposed scheduling work sessions on Coal Bed Methane (CBM) topics before the regular meetings on November 18, 2003, December 16, 2003, and January 6, 2004, dealing with hydrology, geology, and local government;
- asked if the Assembly would like to invite the Planning Commission to the CBM work sessions;
- suggested scheduling bi-monthly work sessions with the Assembly to discuss management and other projects to improve communication; and
- referred to the memorandum listing the options available to the Assembly for providing direction to the Manager and Lobbyist on legislative issues during times when the Assembly is not meeting, or will not meet in time to make comments.

XIV. MAYOR AND ASSEMBLY COMMENTS

Assemblymember Allen:

- thanked Senator Green for attending the meeting tonight; and
- expressed appreciation for the state lobbyist, Ray Gillespie, updating the Assembly.

Assemblymember Vehrs:

- voiced concern regarding the Platting Board and ex parte comments from Ms. Krause; and
- requested the Attorney issue a memorandum to the Assembly regarding this issue.

Ms. Williams stated that she would issue a memorandum to the Assembly regarding the Platting Board and ex parte issue.

Assemblymember Bush stated that he would give a presentation on his recent trip to Colorado at the November 18, 2003, work session.

Assemblymember Colberg expressed concern regarding delegating Assembly power to an individual or a subcommittee to act on state legislation.

Assemblymember Kvalheim:

- stated that the Assembly needs to address state legislation in some manner; and
- noted that 332 people recycled during the last weekend and encouraged others to recycle.

Assemblymember Simpson:

- reminded the Assembly that the Mid-Valley Pathways Alternative School is still seeking a permanent location;
- noted that she would be attending the School Board meeting regarding the budget tomorrow;
- thanked Mr. Swanson for working with the Alaska State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) on the trails adjudication contract; and
- agreed with Assemblymember Colberg regarding delegating Assembly power to an individual or group.

Mayor Anderson:

- asked the Manager to research the liability of the Borough when, for instance, an Assembly member flies in a small aircraft on Borough business;
- stated that he attended the CBM meetings at DNR in Anchorage; and
- noted that the next meeting would be on Thursday, November 6, 2003, at 1:30 p.m. in the Attwood building in Anchorage.

Assemblymember Colberg inquired as to a timetable for when regulations would be drafted as a result of the CBM meetings.

Mr. Duffy replied that the goal of the task force is to have something for the Legislature during this session.

Mayor Anderson:

- reminded the Assembly that AML would be held in Nome next week;
- commented that he attended a presentation at the Willow Community Council on CBM; and
- stated that he attended an awards ceremony at Meadow Lakes Elementary School during which Jan May and Lauri Zimmer won an award from the Alaska State Department of Fish and Game for a project where their students and volunteer parents constructed a walkway over wetlands near the school.
