**MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH  
ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 16-055**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY EXTENDING  
THE TIME LIMIT FOR COMPLETION OF BOROUGH CAPITAL PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 04-004(AM); and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 06-006(AM); and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 07-007(AM); and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough

functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 08-008; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2010, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 09-009; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 10-010; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 11-011; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2013, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 12-012; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly appropriated monies from the central treasury and established the rate of levy for all Borough functions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, by adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 13-013; and

WHEREAS, a portion of Ordinance Serial No. 04-004(AM),  
Ordinance Serial No. 06-006 (AM), Ordinance Serial

No. 07-007(AM), Ordinance Serial No. 08-008, Ordinance Serial No. 09-009, Ordinance Serial No. 10-010, Ordinance Serial No. 11-011, Ordinance Serial No. 012-012, and Ordinance Serial No. 013-013, stated that capital fund appropriations should revert back to the originating fund once the project has been completed or 36 months, whichever is sooner; and

WHEREAS, \$20,000 for Skwentna land acquisition and platting and \$4,602 for Ford F550 Super Cab Flatbed was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2005 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$506,244 for Hatcher Pass grant matching; and \$300,000 for South Central Rail Corridor for grant matching was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2007 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$175,000 grant match for Lake Louise emergency response facility and \$248,500 financial system enhancements was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2008 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$28,500 for trail survey pool; \$125,000 for fish passage project management; \$50,000 grant match for the Central Mat-Su wastewater facility; \$45,000 for municipal entitlement land surveys; \$148,750 for financial system enhancements; \$150,000 for reverse 911 equipment; and \$100,000 for new

pump/tanker was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2009 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$15,000 for trail survey pool; \$28,168 for Sunshine Creek access improvements; \$35,000 for West Big Lake access; and \$85,000 for Emergency Medical Services patient care report computers was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2010 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$35,000 for Big Lake boat launch parking lot expansion; \$350,000 for trail improvements; \$40,000 for underground storage tank fund; \$125,000 for electrical upgrades at solid waste transfer sites; \$35,000 for Emergency Operations Center multi-media system; \$10,212 for carpet replacement Station 6-1; \$40,000 for urban search and rescue protective clothing at Palmer ambulance; \$30,000 for light search and rescue equipment and personal protective equipment; \$30,000 for water rescue personal protective equipment; \$180,000 for a response vehicle; \$150,000 for computer aided dispatch to computer aided dispatch and Alaska Public Safety Information Network interface; \$300,000 for reverse 911; \$45,000 for dry hydrants for Caswell Lakes Fire Service Area; and \$1,250,000 for Station 5-1 land purchase, preparation, and building in Wasilla Lakes Fire Service Area was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2011 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$318,745 for Government Peak Nordic trail and trailhead development; \$593,000 for fiscal year 2012 budgeted appropriations pending legislation for scope of work; \$218,465 for Hatcher Pass Road and transit facility; \$240,000 for northern parks upgrade and improvements; \$175,226 for Parks and Recreation shop upgrades; \$48,000 for Trapper Creek Library Americans with Disabilities Act access signage and parking lot improvements; \$200,000 for road right-of-way acquisitions; \$10,000 for underground storage tank; \$18,000 for North Colony Road Service Area; \$35,000 for Greater Talkeetna Road Service Area; \$20,465 for electrical upgrades for transfer sites; \$5,865 for carpet replacement at Station 6-1; \$23,739 for Emergency Medical Services patient care report computers; \$75,000 for simulation lab training equipment for Central Ambulance; \$20,000 for personal protective equipment; \$30,000 for cardiac monitor/defibrillator replacement for West Lakes Ambulance; \$252,000 for multiple stations facility upgrades and improvements; \$76,000 for apparatus upgrades; \$72,000 for apparatus mobile data terminals; \$1,500,000 for design, preparation, and preliminary civil work for station 6-2; \$75,000 for tanker replacement for Talkeetna Fire Service Area; and \$450,000 for engine replacement for Greater Palmer Fire Service Area was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2012 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$144,000 for grant match for Federal Highway Administration; \$171,949 for fiscal year budgeted appropriations pending legislation for scope of work; \$106,000 for fish passage improvements in the Borough; \$20,667 for highway signage; \$150,000 for trail repairs, maintenance, and construction; \$125,000 for trail survey; \$85,000 for Talkeetna Library and Community Center building design; \$125,000 for municipal entitlement survey; \$75,000 for five-year disposal plan for Community Development; \$95,000 for Dorothy Swanda Jones Building Annex evaluation, design, and construction; \$775,000 for Midway Road Service Area; \$25,000 for North Colony Road Service Area; \$30,000 for fencing for Solid Waste; \$26,078 for electrical upgrades at transfer sites; \$500,000 for E-911 parcel spatial data acquisition; \$250,000 for dispatch governance and implementation plan; \$100,000 for Emergency Medical Services management and performance study; \$23,739 for Emergency Medical Services patient care report computers; \$150,000 for radios, pagers, and personal protective equipment for District #1 core ambulance; \$7,500 for rapid intervention kits; \$15,000 for fitness equipment for West Lakes Fire Service Area; \$160,000 for communications equipment; \$75,000 for site work and landscaping at various fire stations; \$1,200,000 for training complex roads and water system construction; \$120,000 for firehose at the Wasilla-Lakes Fire Service Area; and \$450,000 for fire tanker

replacement for the Greater Palmer Fire Service Area was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2013 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, \$43,055 for SharePoint development and implementation; \$432,661 for payroll benefits system/human resources system; \$75,000 for aerial imagery; \$125,000 for trail survey; \$56,676 for Parks and Recreation shop upgrades; \$83,840 Brett Ice Rink evaluation; \$125,000 municipal entitlement survey; \$26,336 for Dorothy Swanda Jones phase II roof top unit connections; \$1,169,966 for building remodel and upgrade phase II; \$100,000 for land for septage facility; \$742,500 for Midway Road Service Area; \$6,000 for North Colony Road Service Area; \$288,500 for Bogard Road Service Area; \$326,500 for Gold Trail Road Service Area; \$30,500 for Alpine Road Service Area; \$55,000 for Solid Waste Ford F550 super cab flatbed; \$30,000 for construction and demolition cell improvements; \$1,000,000 for E-911 equipment; \$163,968 for Sutton Ambulance building; \$15,000 for a Aluminski for water rescue; \$8,000 for an all-terrain vehicle for rescue; \$275,000 for land for future fire station improvements at Station 7-1; building and property improvements for West Lakes Fire Service Area; \$2,224,700 for self-contained breathing apparatus, radios and communication equipment, exterior painting and repair at Station 6-5, training complex warehouse construction, carpet replacement Station 6-1, and

command vehicle and support vehicle for Wasilla Lakes Fire Service Area; \$50,000 for compressed air foam systems truck for Butte Fire Service Area; \$220,000 water supply tank for Sutton Fire Service Area; \$100,000 for drafting tank at Station 11-2 for Talkeetna Fire Service Area; \$600,000 for fire engine and equipment for Greater Palmer Fire Service Area; and \$100,000 for business development and marketing plan for Port MacKenzie was appropriated through the capital projects fiscal year 2014 listing, or through subsequent legislation; and

WHEREAS, these projects have not been completed and the funds are still required.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This is a non-code ordinance.

Section 2. Extension of time. The Assembly hereby approves the extension of time for the completion of the Borough buildings repair, tourism infrastructure, right-of-way acquisitions, municipal land entitlement surveys, emergency services buildings and equipment projects, solid waste and transfer site projects, park and trail improvements, library and pool improvements, financial system enhancements, fire service and road service area projects, fish passage management, underground storage tank fund, Federal Highway Administration grant match funding South Central rail corridor, waste water facility, low impact development program, water quality

protection, fiscal year 2012 and fiscal year 2013 budgeted appropriations for scope of work, project management system, SharePoint development, flood plain mapping, wetlands program, aerial imagery, ice rink evaluation, and port marketing and development projects to June 30, 2017.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.

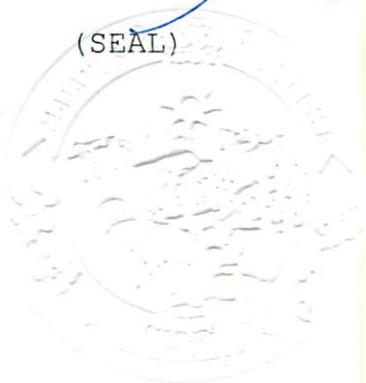
