- noted his agreement with Assemblymember Kowalke regarding post-fire land values;
- stated that he is hopeful that the Assessment Division can work with residents who were impacted by the Sockeye fire to address tax assessment concerns; and
- spoke to his concerns with protecting residential areas from commercial marijuana businesses.

Deputy Mayor Beck:
