
MAINTENANCE

1. Get a Driveway Permit!

Life Cycle of a Road

ROAD SERVICE AREA (RSA)

What is an Road Service Area (RSA)? Road Service Areas are tax revenue generating units of the Borough. The Borough has 16 RSAs. Property taxes are levied by the Assembly for each RSA based on MSB 5.15.019, Taxes, Charges and Assessments, and the annual RSA budget adopted by the Assembly. The Assembly approves all mill levy rates.

How Are RSA Funds Are Spent? The Borough maintains a separate fund for each RSA to account for revenues collected and expenditures. Tax revenues collected by each RSA, plus other revenues, are used exclusively for the direct benefit of that RSA. Expenditures made by a RSA are exclusively for that RSA. Revenues not encumbered or used each budget year are maintained in a fund balance.

Who Makes RSA Decisions? Each RSA has a Board of Supervisors (comprised of three members). All road service area board members are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Assembly.



How to Get Involved with Your RSA


- **Read your annual maintenance contract!**
 - New contracts start in July
 - Outlines condition, timelines, and specification for maintenance
- **Be a RSA Supervisor!**
 - Volunteers needed to fill a vacancies
 - Applications available with the clerk and online
- **Attend RSA Board meetings!**
 - Usually meet quarterly, some meet monthly
 - Calendar online
