Absentee By-Mail Voting

Any registered voter of the Borough may apply for a ballot to be mailed to them by submitting an absentee by-mail ballot application. The application must be received by the Borough Clerk's Office no later than Tuesday, October 27, 2020. Applications are available online at www.matsugov.us/elections or call 861-8683 to request an application.

Please note: The Borough's absentee by-mail application is separate from that of the Alaska State Division of Elections.

Things applicants need to know about the process:

- Apply early to receive your Borough Ballot in a timely manner
- Carefully complete ALL sections of the application
- Omissions or errors may cause a delay in ballot mailing
- Applications MUST contain the applicant's signature; no one else may sign for you

ASSISTANCE TO VOTERS

Anyone needing special assistance in casting their vote due to a disability or bilingual need, may contact the Borough Clerk's Office at 861-8683 at least 24 hours prior to the time of casting their ballot to request assistance.



EARLY/ABSENTEE IN-PERSON VOTING

Voters may choose to vote prior to Election Day at one of the following early/absentee in-person voting locations:

Wasilla Public Library

500 N Crusey Street, Wasilla
 This location is open as follows:

Monday through Friday:

- October 19 through November 2, 2020,
 - 8 a.m.– 5 p.m.

Saturday's:

- October 24 and October 31, 2020, 10 a.m.– 4 p.m.

Sunday's

- October 25 and November 1, 2020, 12 p.m.– 4 p.m.

Mat-Su Borough Administration Building (Dorothy Swanda Jones Building)

350 E. Dahlia Avenue, Palmer

This location is open Monday - Friday, as follows:

- October 19 through November 2, 2020,
 - 8 a.m.– 5p.m.

Saturday and Sunday - Closed

*All ballot types are available at this location.

EARLY VOTING ASSISTANCE

A Touch Screen Voting unit will be available at the Mat-Su Borough (DSJ) Administration Building and the Wasilla Library from October 19 through November 2. Touch screen voting is intended for the blind, disabled, and voters with reading difficulties. The touch screen units allow disabled voters to vote unassisted with a magnified, high contrast and audio ballot.

COVID-19 Information for Voters and Election Officials

What COVID-19 Precautions are being taken for In-Person voting?

CDC recommendations and Alaska State Department of Health & Social Services mandates will be fully implemented at all Polling Places and In-Person/Absentee Voting locations. These consist of, but are not limited to:

- Encouraging voters to wear some type of facial covering and ask that non-essential people (such as children) not go into the polling place or In-Person/Absentee voting locations. If you forget your facial covering and want one while in a polling location, the State of Alaska Division of Elections will provide one.
- Encouraging voters who have health concerns to vote Absentee By-Mail.
- Asking Election Officials to not report to work if they feel ill or have undergone COVID testing and have not received results.
- Election Officials will be provided with PPE such as: masks, face shields, gloves and a table top clear shield.
- Election Officials will be required to disinfect all areas throughout the day that are frequently touched such as voting equipment, booths, tables, pens, secrecy sleeves, door handles, light switches, etc.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for voters to use before checking in, when using voting equipment, and when they exit the polling place. Election Officials will also have hand

sanitizer for their use.

- The polling location will provide 6-foot markings to promote the CDC recommended social distancing and Election Officials will encourage voters to practice social distancing while standing in line being checked in
- Election Officials will make every effort to space voting booths six feet apart
- Election Officials will monitor the number of people in a locations at a time, depending on CDC and HSS guidelines

What to expect at polling places this year:

- The Mat-Su Borough's Regular Election and the State/Federal General Election are being held at the same time and locations this year.
- There are 41 precincts in the Mat-Su Borough:
 - ALL 41 precincts located in the Mat-Su Borough will be **OPEN** and have a State/Federal ballot to vote.
 - 21 of these precincts will also have a Mat-Su Borough ballot to vote.
- Due to social distancing, it is possible that your polling place will not have as many voting booths as they have in the past. This may cause longer wait times.
- Due to the risk associated with large groups gathering (especially in a small indoor space), we will be monitoring, to the best of our

abilities, the number of people inside a polling place at a time. This may cause you to wait in line outside of the polling place

Frequently Asked Questions:

- **Do I have to wear a mask/facial covering when voting in person?**
The Mat-Su Borough strongly encourages voters to wear facial coverings while inside polling locations. If you forget your mask, the State of Alaska Division of Elections will provide one for you.

What will happen if the number of COVID-19 cases rise in Alaska?

- *The Mat-Su Borough is actively monitoring the COVID-19 situation in Alaska and will respond accordingly should the CDC, DHSS, and the Office of the Governor decide if any changes to election procedures are necessary.*

If I apply for an absentee by-mail ballot, do I have to continue voting by-mail forever?

- *No, an absentee by-mail application must be filled out every year in order to receive a by-mail ballot from the Mat-Su Borough.*
